Advancing Production and Conservation in High Rainfall Grazing Systems

The Purcell family run a 1700ha Angus Beef cattle breeding operation near Brungle. The family is also committed to sustainable agriculture, implementing a range of measures to make the land more sustainable whilst enhancing environmental and financial benefits.

As a result of their management initiatives, creeklines have been revegetated, paddocks fenced to land class, new cattle yards installed, woodlands fenced off and grazing management adjusted to enable pastures to regenerate.

This field day is an opportunity to hear from Rodney and his son Andrew on the decisions they have made and the lessons they have learnt in balancing production and sustainability.
