


Hello everyone!

Current Frogwatch Projects:

1. Frogwatch Climate Change Project

Currently in its third and last year, this ACT Government funded project is investigating possible changes in the timing of frog mating calls over the past 30 years. Findings from weekly monitoring at designated sites across the ACT between June and November each year will be compared to frog call data from the 1980s and 90s. Interestingly, the last three years have been very variable:

2015 was very cold,

2016 very wet, and

2017 so far has been very dry.

So, it will be very interesting when we finally get to analyse the data!! A very big thank you to all the amazing Climate Change volunteers collecting the data week after week after week. Well done!!



2. Ginninderry weekly monitoring

The Riverview Group- developer for the new Ginninderry area in West Belconnen - engaged Frogwatch in 2016 to run weekly monitoring of three ponds surrounding the Strathnairn Arts Association between the pre- and post- construction phase of the Ginninderry Link building.

This project has been tracking frog numbers since Spring 2016 to investigate the effects of building activities on frog populations!

I am currently looking for a dedicated volunteer for this site as Valentina, who has done the monitoring for the past few months, has moved on to other enticing projects!!

Doing the regular monitoring is THE best way to learn the different frog calls! Currently only 3-4 species are calling- and soon they will be joined by others- generally one species at the time!! This gives you the opportunity to get your ears tuned into each species – one at the time!!

So, if you live in the local area and are interested in monitoring this site weekly or fortnightly **please please** let me know!!











3. Frog phone

This joint venture with Engineers from the University of Canberra has been right in the middle of plenty media attention. We have currently 1 frog phone deployed at the Strathnairn Arts Association and it works a treat.



4. Tadpole Kits for Schools Program

This year's Tadpole Kits for Schools Program has kicked off and bookings can be made via our webpage (http://www.ginninderralandcare.org.au/node/640). This year we have also included home-schooling families, which have fully embraced the opportunity.

Only a few more days to go before school holidays, so if you know a teacher that would like to use this awesome hands-on learning experience in their class- talk to them asap!!

5. Free frog-talks for (Belconnen) schools

Here at Frogwatch we have been very lucky with great support for our education program. The ACT Herpetological Association (ACTHA) and Rotary Belconnen have both injected some funds into our Frog Talk program for schools. The ACTHA support will ensure that 10 schools around town will have a visit from the "frog lady" while six school in the Belconnen area will enjoy a visit thanks to Rotary Belconnen.

6. Digital Communities Grants

Frogwatch has received funding for a much needed data portal update. This will include using the tried and tested Canberra Nature Map scaffolding of data entry and analysis, ongoing maintenance and updating of the portal!! This is great news for everyone that has been struggling with the current portal!! Happy to hear any suggestions for improvement/changes!! Just send me an email











Grant applications

Frogwatch has currently only one pending grant application; for the test phase of the frog phone, which will include comparing the new method with traditional methods, such as visiting a site in person and-call recording using a tape/mp3 recorder. The application was handed in under the ACT Environment Grant Scheme.

Thanks to the help of Sarah Chaplin we have finally closed the gap and published all Frogwatch Census reports right in time for the 2017 Census!!
