About One River

One River is a multi-state and territory arts project being staged as a part of celebrations for the Centenary of Canberra in 2013, recognising the national capital's location within the Basin and its connection to the watery heart of the country. The project will engage and connect artists and communities throughout the Basin, exploring points of common ground and convergence. The project will interrogate the phrase *My River* - *Our River* – *One River*.

One River is informed by the notion that the rivers of the Murray-Darling Basin are a part of our *common wealth* and that no parts of this vast terrain - including the national capital - are as remote as we might imagine. *One River* will connect the national capital with communities, towns and waterways throughout the Murray-Darling Basin, from the river sources and tributaries of the inland to the various sites of confluence and, ultimately, to the river mouth where the Murray meets the Southern Ocean. These arts based projects will offer the opportunity to connect cultural, scientific and economic thinking about our waterways.

One River will encourage people to tell their story, to listen to others' stories and ultimately to create a new story about our relationship with this most iconic of Australia's river systems.

One River will be launched in Goolwa on 20 October 2012 as part of the Regional Arts Australia national biennial conference. Local projects will take place throughout the Basin during the first half of 2013, with the overall project culminating in Canberra in August 2013.

The *One River* project presents an exciting opportunity for the Centenary of Canberra and the project team to collaborate with skilled and innovative regional artists and communities from across five states and territories and to hear and appreciate their stories and experiences. *One River* will support art projects in 8-10 Murray-Darling Basin communities, leading primarily to local presentation outcomes and then also to representation of artwork in Canberra. In the process of creating the artworks and presentations we aim to stimulate discussion and debate as we reflect upon the complex forces at work within the Murray-Darling Basin river system and how we manage it and its potential as a source of sustenance (and loss) within particular places and environments.

The appointment of local artists will be via expressions-of-interest which will include a proposal for a local project. Artists will need to demonstrate that they have canvassed their idea widely within the community, that they have established partnerships with key organisations and have secured in-kind support (which may include workshop space). This will need to be demonstrated by letters of support.

One River aims

- Create and present art that engages and reflects the social and cultural history of the Murray-Darling Basin across a range of different regions and locations
- Share stories across the Basin and bring people and their stories to Canberra to be heard and celebrated publicly for the Centenary of Canberra
- Recognise and reflect connections between diverse locations across the Basin, including links to Canberra along the Murrumbidgee River

- Provide an opportunity to imagine future possibilities and alternative visions for the management of the river system
- Curate discussions about art and river issues through talks and forums in Canberra, Goolwa and Mildura, incorporating a range of speakers and artist presentations
- Ensure all elements of the project development and delivery meet our collective experience of best practice in relation to arts in a community context

The Role of the Local Artist

The Local Artist will develop a project proposal for a local arts project to be developed in one or more locations within the Murray-Darling Basin. This proposal should be developed with a particular Murray-Darling Basin community in mind and should demonstrate how you plan to involve that community in the creation of an artwork. This may include reference to the number of local workshops you plan to hold to achieve the project and which local partners you might work with. We anticipate most proposals will focus on one specific geographic location, but if you have a proposal that encompasses a broader region with the Basin please talk about your proposal with one of the project team (contact details on page 5).

Local engagement is an important element of the overall project. Local projects should aim to:

- hear and exchange narratives around dependence on the river, local knowledge and history of the river
 facilitate community engagement and story sharing towards creating an exceptional piece/pieces of art
- facilitate community engagement and story sharing towards creating an exceptional piece/pieces of art around the One River theme
- explore a fresh, secret or forgotten story/ies
- bring a new perspective to the experience of living within and managing the Murray-Darling Basin
- produce a local presentation/exhibition outcome

Local delivery of the project has been planned around a series of regular workshops in the local community each about 3 hours in length, but there is flexibility for the local artist to modify the structure to a different structure of time engaging the local community. A total of 100 hours has been budgeted for the workshops that will include development and delivery of the local project outcome. (Please note the project is an 'artist in partnership with community' model and therefore the project needs to engage the local community). Those who successfully apply to become a Local Artist will agree to participate in a briefing process prior to commencing their community workshops.

Skills and experience required

- Demonstrated experience working as an artist within a community context
- Demonstrated understanding of the issues the project will explore
- Excellent people skills and ability to engage with people from culturally diverse backgrounds and with young people
- Demonstrated experience and/or willingness to work under the direction of an Artistic Director;
- Strong organisational and time management skills
- Willingness to undertake a police check if required
- Availability for important project dates including induction, production and evaluation briefings

Project support team

The Executive Producer of *One River* is former Director of Regional Arts Victoria, Lindy Allen. The Artistic Advisor for the project, Donna Jackson, will support the local artists through induction and production workshops and provide artistic direction to the development and delivery of the local projects and also to

the outcome in Canberra. She will ensure the overall project remains focussed on the core goal of creating art that engages residents of the Murray Darling Basin and she will have final approval for the outcomes of the project. The Curator of Stories for the project, Malcolm McKinnon, will work with Donna to establish a thematic framework to guide the development and collection of stories at a local level. He will select stories from several areas to create a series of short films that will be central to the development and documentation of the project.

Networking/exchange/documentation

The *One River* website (www.oneriver.com.au) will act as a project journal and nation-wide communication tool. This will stimulate networking and creative exchange between the artists located across the different project sites. Participating artists and community participants will be encouraged and supported to view project outcomes at other locations across the broader *One River* program. The website will go live on Sat 20 October 2012.
