

Role of the Regional Landcare Facilitator (2013–18)

Caring for our Country outcomes

Regional Landcare Facilitators (RLFs) will contribute to developing a skilled and capable Landcare community¹ within their region, and will contribute to the following Caring for our Country (Sustainable Agriculture stream) outcomes:

- increase the percentage of farming and fishing entities and land managers with the knowledge and skills to manage our natural resources and deliver ecosystem services
- increase the capacity and confidence of regional community leaders, including women, young people, Indigenous Australians and people from culturally diverse communities involved in agriculture or fisheries production and the protection of natural resources
- increase engagement and participation by regional communities and groups, including Landcare, professional farming system groups, industry, other community groups or individuals in natural resource management activities
- increase community awareness and understanding of the status of Australia's natural resources (land, forests and fisheries)
- increase the percentage and area of farming entities using sustainable land management practices to increase productivity and improve the quality of ecosystem services delivered to the broader community from their land, while building their resilience to climate change
- 1The term "Landcare community" refers to individuals and groups who actively care for the land and natural resources. This includes land holders as well as volunteers working on public and private land and a range of community and production groups, not all of which describe themselves as Landcare groups.

- increase the percentage of fishing and aquaculture entities that have adopted sustainable and low environmental impact management practices to increase productivity
- increase the number and area of farming and fishing sector entities that have trialled innovative practices for improved natural resources management

Regional NRM organisations are expected to engage with the community to achieve against the above outcomes under the Regional Delivery component of Caring for our Country. RLFs are a mechanism by which they can achieve this – the role of the RLF is as an "enabler" who supports the community within their region to achieve the outcomes.

Role statement

The Regional Landcare Facilitator is expected to engage with land managers, local and regional Landcare groups, farming systems or grower groups and related community organisations to support the community within their region to achieve the above Caring for our Country (Sustainable Agriculture stream) outcomes. The RLF role will focus predominantly on working with community members and groups which have a sustainable agriculture focus.

Sustainable Agriculture stream

The Regional Landcare Facilitator will:

- 35 Promote the Landcare ethic and sustainable agriculture to farmers and land managers For example, by:
 - o delivering information about best practice and new innovations and encouraging the sharing of information and experiences across the region
 - o advising land managers and community groups of emerging issues and threats (e.g. weeds)
 - o linking community with specialist sources of information
 - oraising awareness in the wider community of Landcare issues and opportunities to contribute
- $^{35}_{17}$ Assist Landcare and community groups to seek funding, membership and resources for NRM activities and to build their capacity and skills

For example, by:

- o informing the community about funding opportunities
- o building the capacity of groups to attract and sustain funding and membership
- oidentifying synergies across the region and linking up similar projects to create efficiencies
- o linking groups with industry, research organisations and with government
- o supporting and mentoring existing and potential regional community leaders
- Support the development, delivery, monitoring and evaluation of the region's community engagement plan or strategy²

For example, by:

- o contributing to strategic planning
- opromoting and facilitating engagement of the Landcare community with the regional body
- o supporting the development of a training calendar
- opromoting training and workshops
- o assisting baseline data collation and elements of monitoring progress against baselines
- Increase awareness of Australian Government policies and funding programs relevant to Sustainable Agriculture including Caring for our Country and the Clean Energy Future Land Sector Package
- Report on the state of Landcare in the region³
- Contribute to the maintenance of up to date contact details of Landcare groups⁴ in the region in an identified national Landcare directory⁵
- Provide feedback to the Commonwealth on emerging issues in the region, relevant to sustainable agriculture practices and Landcare community needs
- Participate in the Regional Landcare Facilitator network, including attending biannual national and state events
- Deliver other activities as may be requested by the Minister or DAFF
- Project component: Deliver community capacity building activities to achieve against the identified Caring for our Country (Sustainable Agriculture stream) outcomes, in response to community need (further information is provided overleaf)

The Regional Landcare Facilitator is not to:

- Deliver or manage Caring for our Country or other projects on behalf of the regional body or host organisation
- Undertake line management of regional body or host organisation staff

²Note that the RLF is expected to support and contribute to these activities in line with their facilitation role however the RLF will not be expected to lead on these activities or to be responsible for writing the plan.

- Fulfil any other organisational management responsibilities within the regional body or host organisation
- Undertake any work of a commercial nature for the regional body or host organisation

Undertake any additional responsibilities which do not reasonably fall within the above role statement, unless prior written approval has been granted by DAFF.

Key relationships

At **regional** level:

Minimum selection criteria

Regional Landcare Facilitators will possess the following minimum skills and capabilities:

- 35 Strong knowledge and experience of Landcare, sustainable agriculture and natural resource management issues relevant to the region
- High level facilitation, communication and interpersonal skills
- Demonstrated ability to build productive relationships and work collaboratively with diverse stakeholder groups including farmers, land managers, Landcare and other community based organisations, and government representatives
- Demonstrated ability to facilitate the delivery of effective community capacity building activities for farmers, land managers and community groups

Community Capacity Building activities (project component)

Budget of at least \$30 000 per year is to be provided for the RLF position for the purpose of delivering enabling activities in response to community needs. Such activities should have a community capacity building focus and will assist the community to achieve the identified Caring for our Country (Sustainable Agriculture stream) outcomes. Specific activities must be endorsed by the RLF Steering Committee and agreed by DAFF.

Appropriate activities include, but are not limited to:

35 capacity building workshops

³⁵₁₇peer learning activities

35 farm based demonstration activities

³⁵₁₇awareness raising events

35 extension and communications materials

The **target groups** will be:

³⁵Landcare groups

³⁵₁₇farming systems or grower groups

35 land managers

³⁵/regional community leaders involved in agriculture production and the protection of natural resources

Up to \$5,000 per year may be used to support community members to attend conferences, events or training activities where:

³⁵/_{the} recipients are community members and have been identified through a transparent process

35/the activity directly contributes to (a) increasing the capacity and confidence of regional community leaders or (b) improving the knowledge and skills of land managers

The following activities will **not** be considered an appropriate use of these funds:

35 activities targeting schools / school children⁶

³⁵/₁₇ any form of on-ground activities (with the exception of approved demonstration activities)

³⁵/₇activities that are primarily for political lobbying (e.g. protesting a development)

³⁵₁₇activities designed to raise revenue

³⁵/₁₇sponsoring individuals to attend events or gain qualifications (with the exception of those covered by the \$5,000 allowance above)

³⁵providing a donation to an organisation

³⁵₁₇providing sponsorship to an event⁷

³⁵providing incentive payments for practice change

³⁵ any other form of sponsorship, devolved grant, gift or incentive to individuals or organisations

⁶RLFs may have some involvement with schools in their role (e.g. promoting funding opportunities to a school-based Junior Landcare group) however school students are not a focus for the program and activities targeting them should not form part of the project component. School based activities *may* be appropriate if they demonstrably target the identified target groups.

⁷ Elements of an event which the RLF is involved in organising may be funded if it is directly relevant to achieving the Caring for our Country targets. Donations or general sponsorship to events are <u>not</u> appropriate.
