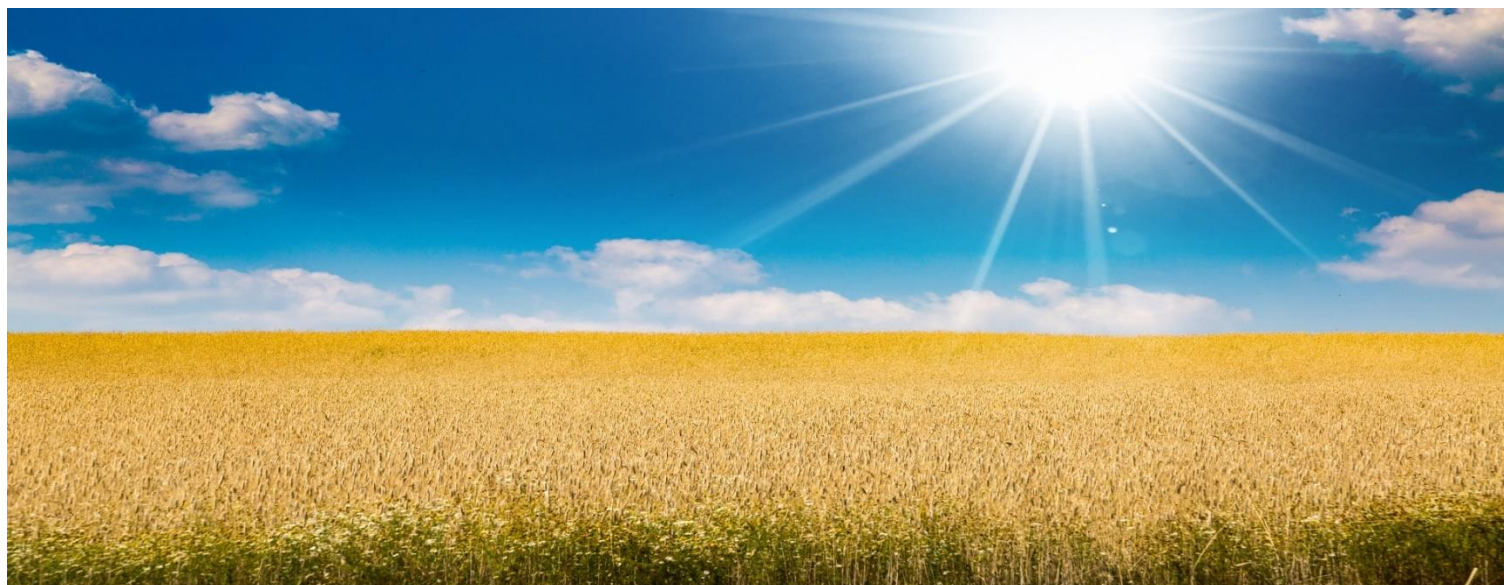


Join us for soup, supper and conversation!
