Colin will talk about his experiences over the last 20 years since he moved away from a conventional system, sharing his practical insights on pasture cropping, native grass management and land management, and the ways in which farmers can combine them to achieve profitable, regenerative agriculture.

Vince Heffernan: Ecological agriculture and biodynamics. Vince and his family run Moorlands Lamb using an organic/biodynamic approach, combined with rotational grazing. Vince will talk about how and why they moved away from a conventional grazing enterprise, and the benefits, pitfalls and tips they've learned along the way.
